Community Against Violence (CAV) has provided northern New Mexico communities with emergency services, shelter, counseling, and housing to survivors of domestic and sexual violence, and child and elder abuse. A major reason CAV has been successful is the financial donations and dedicated volunteer support from our community members. Thanks to this, CAV provided

885 people with confidentia and free services this last



CAV's award winning Transitional Housing Program provides subsidized housing for up to 24 months to individuals and families leaving emergency shelter or unsafe living situations. Based on the unique needs of each household, the program tailors support and resources for participants to develop stability and skills to live safely and independently again.

Since expanding the program to off-site leased housing, CAV has housed 35 households, and is currently housing 12 households of 12 adults and 12 children.

PAST CAV TRANSITIONAL HOUSING PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS SHARE THEIR STORIES:

"It's hard to believe that just a few months ago I was in shelter, had no iob and was severely depressed. Now my child and I live in a safe. warm and peaceful home. CAV's shelter provides a safe place for survivors and their families who are fleeing from domestic and sexual violence. Last year the shelter provided:

• 9,965 shelter nights to 179 Adults and 98 Children



Advocates and counselors provide crisis intervention, case management, therapy. and advocacy and support for survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and child ahuse

- 10.881 hours of services to 885 adult. child, and elderly survivors
- 2.066 hours of individual counseling to 117 survivors: 434 hours of group counseling to 57 survivors



New Mexico's first nationally-accredited forensic interview and specialized advocacy program, the Northern New Mexico Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) is in its 23rd year of providing forensic interviews and support services to children (and adults with disabilities) in cases of abuse and nealect. The CAC serves residents of Taos, Colfax, Union, Rio Arriba, Mora, San Miguel, and Guadalupe counties. and the northern Pueblos. Last fiscal year. the CAC handled 249 cases.

MEET THE CAV SFRVICE DOGS!

Clark, CAV's original facility service dog, is ready to enjoy retired after 8 years of dedicated service. Carmel, his nephew, is taking the lead in our weekly Dog Group, a play therapy program for child survivors. This past year in Dog Group, 20 child clients of CAV helped to train Carmel and his friends, brothers and sister-Sat. Stubbs, Nelson, Trakr, and

Patty (black Labradors).

CAV PREVENTION **OUTREACH AND EDUCATION**

Our Prevention, Outreach, and Education team works to educate and enagge the entire community in preventing domestic and sexual violence of children and adults. Their iob is to raise awareness through educational presentations, business training, community events, and media awareness on how to stop violence before it happens. Last year, the prevention program:

• Reached 647 students through 164 classes and community outreach programs including 8 community organizations. businesses, and schools to enhance safety at their location for both

• Organized and participated in 17 community events reaching 1.647 people
